Unifying Opposites through Metaphor: A Cognitive Approach ...

Metaphors underlying our approach to understanding the mind/brain. The brain is electrical, but it is also driven by fluids (blood) and chemicals (hormones and neurotransmitters). Most importantly, the brain is part of a body which it drives to action, and research from an embodiment perspective also shows that the whole body (not just the brain) affects emotion, motivation, and other psychological processes.
