First Grade Factory: The Power of Anticipation Guides

An Anticipation/Reaction Guide utilizes a twin strategy to increase reading comprehension: stimulate prior knowledge and experiences before reading and then reinforce key concepts after reading. The guide presents students with a series of leading questions to be answered in writing before reading.

The Anticipation Guides strategy asks students to express their opinions about ideas before they encounter them in a text or unit of study. Completing anticipation guides helps students recognize and connect to themes that surface in their learning. Use this strategy at the beginning of a unit or before engaging with a text.

The Outsiders: Anticipation Guide

This anticipation guide allows the students to establish their current position on certain issues that will be addressed in the novel Fahrenheit 451 by Ray Bradbury. Students are expected to write 1-2 sentences responding to each question. I reassure them that there is no technically correct answer to any of the questions.

The Crucible Anticipation Guide

An Anticipation Guide is a strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading a selection, students respond to several statements that challenge or support their preconceived ideas about key concepts in the text.

Anticipation Guide Questions

An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts presented in the text; they're often structured as a series of statements with which the students can choose to agree or disagree.
