It laid out new rights for Native Americans, reversed some of the earlier privatization of their common holdings, and encouraged tribal sovereignty and land management by tribes. The act slowed the assignment of tribal lands to individual members and reduced the assignment of "extra" holdings to nonmembers.

Far from a "golden age" of Indians living in harmony with nature, their relationship was one in which they altered the landscape but did so in a way that was less destructive (for example, using fire to clear woodland areas, replenish soil nutrients, and attract game animals), creating a mosaic or patchwork quality of tremendous diversity.

The way the new colonist came to the new world and saw how the Indians lived, calling them lazy because of their lack of commitment to surviving as opposed to their women. the clashing of ideas between the Indians and the colonist, an older generation who knew what they had to do to survive, and a new generation who believed that a change was necessary in how the land was treated was crucial for both to live better is similar to what happened in Philomath.

Changes in the Land

Instead of the seasonal migration that the Indians practiced, European settlers strove to "improve" the land. This meant a greater use of agriculture than the Indians. The use of livestock such as cattle, hogs, and sheep to the environment was also introduced.

Likewise, Cronon's earlier effort, *Changes in the Land: Indians, Colonists, and the Ecology of New England* (1983) attempts to extend historical boundaries past "human institutions - economies, class, and gender systems, political organizations, cultural rituals - to the natural ecosystems which provide the context for these institutions." Cronon cautions readers to not draw the wrong conclusions from his work.
