Charlotte Perriand (1903–1999) was a French architect and designer, and one of the most acclaimed figures to have emerged from the studio environment around Le Corbusier. Born in Paris in 1903, Perriand died in the same city at the age of 96, in 1999. She studied at L'Ecole de l'Union Centrale des Arts Decoratifs (which translates to School of the Central Union of Decorative Arts) and spent nearly all of her life in Paris, France, enthralled by the glitzy capital city.
