Parents also have a financial duty to support their children, which typically continues until each child reaches the age of 18 or graduates from high school. In most cases, a parent doesn't have a financial responsibility to a child over 18, unless the child has special needs.

Filial Responsibility Laws were created in some states which pass the obligation of paying for the basic care and needs of an aging parent to their adult children. This law dates back to the early 1600's English law known as the Elizabethan Poor Law. These Poor Laws as they were known, were created in a time of economic depression.

Answers about Children and the Law

Most states that have parental responsibility laws have established the rule that parents can be held responsible for the acts of their child only until the child reaches 18 years of age. However, at least one state has expanded parental responsibility to include children up to 21 years of age in certain situations.
