In a high-risk (at-risk) pregnancy, the mother, fetus, or neonate is at increased risk of morbidity or mortality before or after delivery. In 2015, overall maternal mortality rate in the US was 14/100,000 deliveries, as estimated by the WHO; incidence is 3 to 4 times higher in nonwhite women.
