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Language development: Speech milestones for babies - Mayo ...

Articulation/Speech. Uses sentence-like intonations (jargon)
Some echolalia. Uses most vowels and consonants in jargon.
Omits final consonants and some initial consonants. Basically unintelligible with exception of a few words. Words produced with consonant vowel-structure (bo/boat) emerge.
