There are overarching patterns in knowing: empiric (through the senses), ethics (obligation), personal, aesthetics (relating to the art of nursing), and emancipatory knowing (Chinn & Kramer, 2008). There are five dimensions to the knowledge process: critical questions, creative processes, formal practice of knowledge and knowing, integrative practice of knowledge and knowing, and authentication processes (Chinn

Nursing Theories and Practice

Nursing involves processes, dynamics, and interactions that are most effective when the five knowing patterns of empirics, ethics, aesthetics, personal knowing, and emancipatory knowing come together. Praxis is possible when all patterns of knowing are integrated in a way that supports social justice.

The four patterns of knowing as identify by Carper, are empirics, esthetics, personal knowledge and ethics. More recently, Chin & Kramer (2008) added the fifth, emancipatory knowing (Jackson, 2009). As stated by Carper (1978), these patterns represented the complex phenomenon of knowing that nurses use when caring for their patients.

Nursing theory aims to describe, predict and explain the phenomenon of nursing (Chinn and Jacobs 1978). It should provide the foundations of nursing practice, help to generate further knowledge and indicate in which direction nursing should develop in the future (Brown 1964).

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At a time when the scientific community relied mostly on the objective, empirical, and analytical explanations of phenomena, Carper (1978) proposed the different patterns of knowing to structure nursing education and evaluate nursing practice. The different patterns of knowing are empirics, aesthetics, ethics, and personal.

The nursing process has three steps in Rogers' Theory of Unitary Human Beings: assessment, voluntary mutual patterning, and evaluation. The areas of assessment are: the total pattern of events at any given point in space-time, simultaneous states of the patient and his or her environment, rhythms of the life process, supplementary data, categorical disease entities, subsystem pathology, and pattern appraisal.
