Make S.M.A.R.T. Speech Therapy Goals: Specific, Measurable ...

SMART goals: time-bound. The final element of SMART goals is making them time-bound. But what does it mean? It essentially means setting yourself a deadline for achieving your goal. For example, 'learn 20 French verbs by the end of next week'.

My 5-Step Process to Achieving Your Goals as a Speech ...

Step Three: Choose an Area of Concern and Write a Goal. This means, you can't just use the same goal for everyone on your caseload. Each goal should be customized to what that child needs. Also, the goals should be relevant to the child's educational needs. We can go back to our example of head-stands as a goal that would not be relevant to a child's educational needs.

Writing Measurable Short and Long Term Goals

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Example: Make 10 requests for items using visual support is a more specific goal than Improve communication. Complete 3 turns in a peer conversation during a social group session is a more specific goal than talk more with other children. M - Measureable It is necessary for a goal to be measureable so that it can be evaluated at a set date at the end of the therapy plan.

Examples of SMART Goals and Objectives

Including Baselines: You also may want to change the location of the goal from your baseline as well. For example, you could say that the child will go from doing a skill in the speech therapy room with 80% accuracy to in the classroom with 80% accuracy.
