North Carolina is like most states in that the statute of limitations that applies to a car accident lawsuit will usually be the same as the one that applies to most personal injury cases. Specifically, North Carolina General Statutes section 1-52 says that a civil lawsuit for injury or damage to property must be filed within three years .

North Carolina Car Accident Laws

Car Accident Statute of Limitations in North Carolina. You have three years from your car accident injuries date to file a personal injury claim or lawsuit. You also have three days from the date of the accident to file a claim for your property damages. For wrongful death, you must file a lawsuit within two years of the person's date of death.

REPORTING AN ACCIDENT TO THE NORTH CAROLINA DMV You are not required to report any accidents to the North Carolina Division of Motor Vehicles. Nonetheless, all accidents that involve death, injury or property damage exceeding \$1,000 must be reported to the Police.

North Carolina Car Accident and Personal Injury Laws

North Carolina is a "fault" or tort-based state, meaning that if you were hurt in a car accident you can recover from the driver who caused the accident, or was "at fault." ("Fault" states are discussed in comparison to "no-fault" states in which an injured party recovers from their insurance company, regardless of who was at fault.)

Generally speaking, in North Carolina the statute of limitations for a personal injury claim resulting from a car accident is three (3) years from the date of injury. See N.C. Gen. Stat. § 1-52. For example, if you were in a car accident on 3/5/2014, you must file a lawsuit or resolve your claim before 3/6/2017.
